IFFO RS Improver Participant (IP) Agreement (Participant)

- 1.Acknowledge that all communications with the IFFO RS regarding the FIP project will be made through those appointed as coordinators by the resolutions of all participants.
- 2.Accept to participate in the development of the FIP project by providing technical information, attending training and information sharing, as well as being aware of the details relating to the agreement between the participants. FIP program must be defined and accepted by each participant in this application form.
- 3. Acknowledge that signing this document will not restrict your right to participate in other similar projects from other organizations or companies.
- 4. Acknowledge that accepting new participants for the FIP program must be approved by at least 75% of the current program participants. Benefits of the FIP trawl project in the Gulf of Thailand

- 5. Acknowledge that accepting new participants for the FIP program, the project operator representing the participants must submit a document (Form 3C) with details of the new participants to ensure that these new participants will understand and be aware of the terms and conditions.
- 6. Acknowledge that IFFO RS is not involved in determining the financial division or force payment of participants.
- 7. Acknowledge that the progress and development report of the FIP project must be notified to the assessors and published on the website. www.fisheryprogress.org or comparable websites approved by IFFO RS and / or IFFO RS websites.
- 8. Agree to comply with the time frame specified in the Fishery Action Plan (FAP).
- 9.Acknowledge that in the case of the same stock of fish, many Fishery Improvement Programs (FIPs) are required to manage the coordination between the FIP projects. Therefore, it is very important in order to comply with the fishery development objectives. If there is no coordination between the projects, it may not be approved.

Benefits of the FIP trawl project in the Gulf of Thailand

- 1. The list of participants will be published on the IFFO RS IP website within the FIP trawl project in the Gulf of Thailand.
- 2. Fishmeal companies that wish to apply for IFFO IP can use evidence of participation in the IFFO IP certification process.
- 3. Aquaculture feed companies that wish to apply for BAP certification can use evidence of their participation in the BAP assessor in the Sustainable Fishmeal Raw Material Requirements.
- 4. Aquaculture feed companies that wish to sell products to shrimp farms that would like to meet ASC standards can use evidence of their participation in the ASC assessors of shrimp farms in the food requirements used in the farm.
